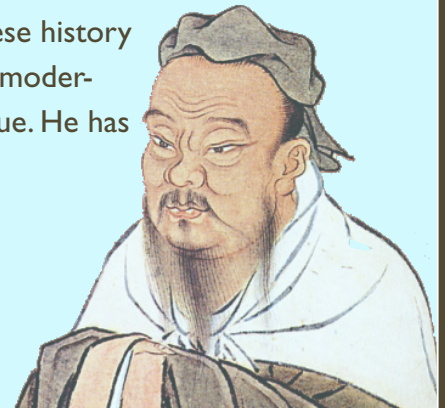

About the speaker: Tu Wei-ming is Harvard-Yenching Professor of Chinese History and Philosophy and of Confucian Studies in the Department of East Asian Languages and Civilizations at Harvard University. His research interests include Confucian humanism and ethics, Chinese history and philosophy, theories of modernity and civilizational dialogue. He has

published six books in English and four in Chinese.

Tu is also on the editorial board of the *Harvard Journal of Asiatic Studies* and *Philosophy East and West*. Additionally, he served as director of the Harvard-Yenching Institute from 1996 to 2008 and is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
